AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BEAVERDAM, ALLEN COUNTY, OHIO, AMENDING ORDINANCES 1999-37, 2000-16, 2000-20, 2007-19, 2007-43, 2008-18, 2011-17; MAINTAINING REGULATIONS FOR THE SAFE, ECONOMICAL AND EFFICIENT MANAGEMENT AND PROTECTION OF THE VILLAGE WATERWORKS, THE VILLAGE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM, THE VILLAGE WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES AND ESTABLISHING A NEW RENTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE EXPENSES OF CONDUCTINGAND MANAGING SAID WORKS, SYSTEMS AND SERVICES

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of Beaverdam deems it necessary to maintain regulations for the safe, economical and efficient management and protection of the Village Water Works, Village Sanitary Sewer System, and the Village Waste Collection Services; and

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of Beaverdam deems it necessary to establish a new rent upon all tenements and premises supplied with water by the Village Water Works for the purpose of paying the expenses of conducting and managing the waterworks; and

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of Beaverdam deems it necessary to establish a new rent upon all tenements and premises connected to the Village Sanitary Sewer System for the purpose of paying the expenses of conducting and managing the Sewer System; and

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of Beaverdam deems it necessary to establish a new rent upon all tenements and premises serviced by the Village contracted waste collection program for the purpose of paying the expenses of such.

NOW, THEREFORE be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Beaverdam, Allen County, State of Ohio, at least three-fourths of the members concurring that the foregoing Village of Beaverdam Utility Regulations are hereby adopted and set in place at the earliest time allowed by law.
